No matter which one you choose, you will notice that all are dedicated to teaching, training and producing nationally- and internationally-ranked swimmers and divers.

All Boarding. The students lives on campus.

Boarding-Day Schools. The majority of students live on campus, while some commute from local neighborhoods or towns.

Military Schools. The student body follows a military structure. Often, the schools require uniforms and drill practices.

5-Day Boarding Schools. The students may elect to stay only during the week and go home on the weekends.

Junior Boarding Schools. Schools that accept students in grades 1-8, usually 6-8.

Coeducational Schools. Schools that accept both boys and girls.

Boys Schools. Schools that accept only boys.

Girls Schools. Schools that accept only girls.

Pre-Professional Arts Schools. Schools that specialize in training musical, performing and visual artists.

Religious Schools. Schools that are affiliated with a specific religion.
